

Hepatitis B Vaccine – Declination Form

Hepatitis B is a liver infection caused by the Hepatitis B virus (HBV). Hepatitis B is transmitted via blood and/or body fluid. For some people, hepatitis B is an acute, or short-term, illness but for others, it can become a long-term, chronic infection. Chronic Hepatitis B can lead to serious health issues, like cirrhosis or liver cancer. The best way to prevent Hepatitis B is by receiving the vaccine.

CDC recommends all healthcare workers who may be exposed to blood, or other potentially infectious body fluids, complete the Hepatitis B three-vaccination series.

Possible vaccine side effects may include local reactions, injection site soreness, and/or fatigue.
